Class Selection

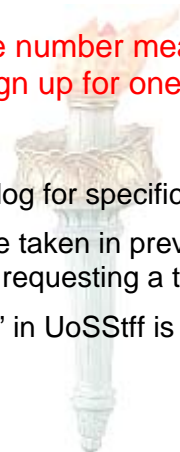

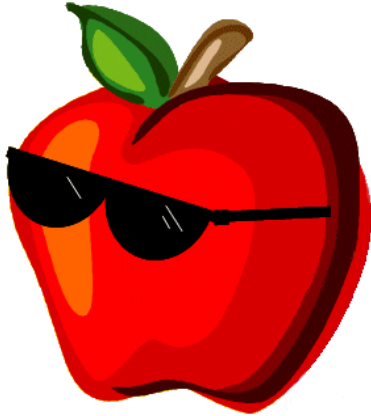

Things to Remember:

- 2010 University of Scouting, University of Alabama in Huntsville, Saturday, March 6, 2010.
- Registration begins at 7:30 A.M. in the University Center (building 7). Come early to make schedule changes.
- Opening Ceremony begins at 9:00 A.M. in the University Center Exhibition Hall (room 102). Classes begin at 9:30 A.M. and end at 3:45 P.M. The Closing & Awards Ceremony is at 4:00 P.M. in the University Center Exhibition Hall. **All of the participants who complete pre-registration and payment by the February 26 deadline will be eligible for fabulous prizes at the Closing Ceremony.**
- Scout Shop hours of operation are 8:00 AM until 4:00 PM in the University Center Exhibition Hall.
- Lunch is available in the UAH cafeteria in the University Center for \$6.50 if you pre-register for lunch. If you do not pre-pay with your on-time registration then lunch will be \$7.50. Numerous fast food restaurants are located within ½ miles should you wish to eat elsewhere.
- Walk-in participants will pay \$15.00 total, \$22.50 including lunch. The purpose of this late fee is to encourage pre-registration and scheduling. Receipts will be mailed back to those who pre-register by mail or fax. Bring your receipt to the UoS to preclude any registration problems.
- Directions: Turn right at the forth red light on Sparkman Drive after crossing the railroad track bridge traveling North (look for signs). Look for Boy Scouts and/or signs to provide directions for parking and to registration at UAH.

Directions: The University of Alabama in Huntsville is located on Sparkman Drive between I-565 and University Drive. Take the Sparkman exit off I-565 (exit 15) and go north. Turn right at the fourth red light after crossing the railroad tracks toward the Bevill Center. Then take an immediate left on Ben Graves Drive and go to the University Center parking lot on your right.
